

By bus to the Churchill Hospital

City Centre to Girdlestone Road for the Churchill

15 City – Old Road – Girdlestone Road – Wood Farm Catch the bus at St. Aldates or High Street (Queens Lane). Get off in Girdlestone Road, and walk through to the Churchill. Runs every 10 mins. Journey time 12 minutes plus 5 minutes walk.

From north of Oxford

2A,B,C,D, Summertown towards the City or **7/7A** to City Centre (High Street) and change to **15**.

From east of Oxford

600 from Thornhill direct to the Churchill Hospital.

8, 7, 7C from Barton; **8A** from Risinghurst; **280** from Aylesbury, Thame and Wheatley; **400** from Thornhill Park & Ride. These services stop in Headington.

From south and south east of Oxford

U5 from Cowley via The Slade to Girdlestone Road for the Churchill.

Any route to the City and change to **15** at St. Aldates or High Street (Queens Lane). **10** from Cowley, getting off on the Slade or Windmill Road.

From west of Oxford

4, U1 from Botley and **400** from Seacourt Park & Ride and change to **15** at High Street (Queens Lane).

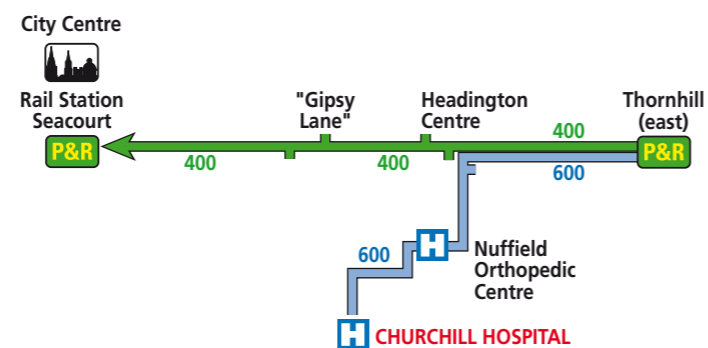

Park & Ride bus service

The nearest park & ride car park is Thornhill, on the A40 1 mile east of Headington.

Service 600: Thornhill to the Churchill Hospital. It serves all bus stops and circulates the Churchill site, stopping at the old (east) main entrances, Sobell House and OCDEM. It runs Monday to Friday, between 07:00 and 19:00 approximately. The frequency is every 20 minutes.

Service 400: Thornhill - Seacourt via City Centre. Stops in Headington centre and on Headington Road at Gipsy Lane, about 15 minutes walk from the Churchill. Monday to Saturday day time frequency is every 15 minutes.



About the Churchill Hospital

The Churchill Hospital opened during the Second World War as an emergency hospital for US armed service personnel. It is now a centre for specialist services including cancer, renal, transplant, chest medicine, haemophilia and diabetes. Over the period to 2008 there will be substantial development including new buildings for cancer services.

How to find us

On foot or bicycle – the healthy option

The hospital is within 15 to 20 minutes walk of Headington Centre. It has entrances onto Old Road and paths to Cowley Road and Girdlestone Road/The Slade, making access easy from a number of directions.

A map of Oxford's cycle network is available from the County Council, www.oxfordshire.gov.uk, and Footways to the site are shown on the map inside.

Cycle parking is available at the hospital, see plan.

From further afield

By train

The hospital is 3 miles from Oxford railway station, with its frequent trains from London (Paddington) and many other parts of the UK. Allow 15 minutes by taxi from the station forecourt or bus number 5, changing at Queens Lane to the 15.

By coach

The Oxford Express X90 and the Oxford Tube operate a frequent service 24 hours a day to and from central London, stopping in Headington Centre and at Gipsy Lane, about 15 minutes walk.

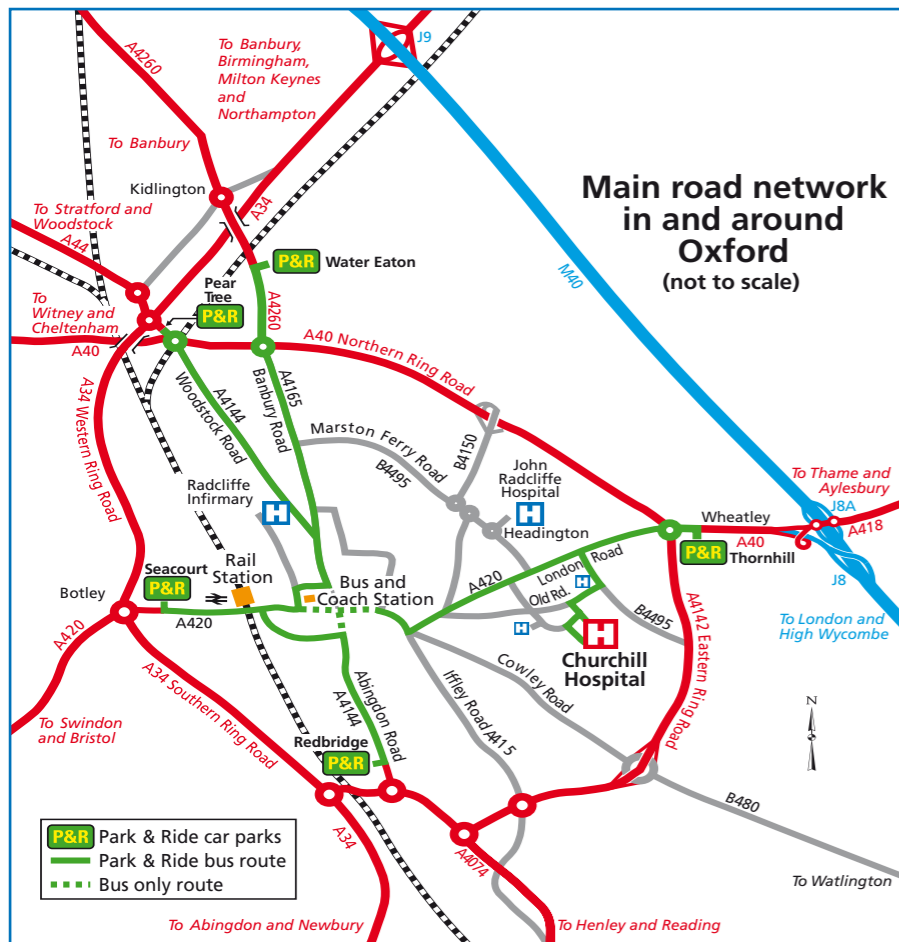
By air

Headington is well placed for airports in London and Birmingham. London Heathrow is about 70 minutes by bus - Oxford Express X70. There is also an Oxford Express X80, to London Gatwick. These services stop in Headington Centre and by Gipsy Lane.

Car travel and parking

Parking at the hospital is limited and finding a space is usually difficult after 9:30am on weekdays. There are good bus and park & ride services. Please use these where possible and avoid parking problems. See details in this leaflet.

From the east, M40 Junction 8 or 8a, take the A40 then A420 to Headington Centre and follow signs. From the north, M40 Junction 9, take the A34 then A40 northern ring road, turning off for Marston (B4150), then B4495 towards Headington and follow signs. From the south and west, approach from the A4142 Eastern ring road and B4495.

Parking is currently pay & display. Minimum charge £3.00 for up to 4 hours.

Disabled parking

Parking for orange or blue badge holders is free of charge. Disabled Blue Badge parking and areas for setting down and collecting patients are available close to entrances, see hospital plan. The main parking for Blue Badge holders is in car park 4. Wheelchairs are available here.
